Woman charged with break and enters - Eastwood

Sometime between 2pm and 7:30pm on Wednesday 30 October 2019, a 26-year-old woman from Blacktown has entered a home in Read Street, Eastwood. The woman has stolen a number of items from the home including documents and jewellery. About 7:30pm the owners returned home to find that their house had been broken into and contacted police who arrived a short time later.

About 10:30am on Monday 25 November 2019, the owner of a home in Valley Road, Eastwood left his residence. At this time his daughter remained at the location alone. A short time later she heard the doorbell ring numerous times however she did not answer the door.

A short time after that she heard footsteps inside the house so she left out the back door and contacted her father. The resident then saw the 26-year-old woman along with another man inside a vehicle. The resident obtained the registration of the vehicle and contacted police.

On Thursday 28 November 2019 police attended the woman's home address and placed her under arrest. She was taken to Blacktown Police Station where she was charged with Break & Enter house and steal, Aggravated Break and Enter dwelling etc in company intend to steal and Enter building/land with intent to commit indictable offence.

The woman was refused bail to appear in Blacktown Local Court on 29 November 2019 where she was granted conditional bail. The woman is now due to appear in Burwood Local Court on 11 December 2019.

Teenager charged with Take and detain for advantage – Gladesville

About 5:00pm on Tuesday 1 October 2019, a 14-year-old boy from Gladesville and a group of approximately seven friends alighted a bus at Victoria Road, Henley opposite Gladesville Reserve. The group of teenagers have then entered Gladesville Reserve.

As the teenagers have entered the reserve a group of other teenagers who were riding their bikes in the riding trails saw the teens enter the reserve and decided to leave the area. However, on leaving the area, one of their friends a 16-year-old boy was still inside the reserve riding his bike.

The 14-year-old boy has approached the 16-year-old as he was riding along one of the trails. The 16-year-old stopped his bike and on doing this the group of boys surrounded him. The 14-year-old has produced a flick knife and demanded the 16-year-old boy call his friends to return to the trails. The 16-year-old contacted his friend on his phone however the boys suspected that their friend may be in trouble.

The group of boys approached some adults nearby who contacted police. The boys then yelled out to their friend that the police have been called. On hearing this the group of teenagers and the 14-year-old boy left the reserve. Police arrived a short time later.

About 8.30am on 27 November 2019, the 14-year-old boy was arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station where he was charged with Take/detain person with intent to obtain advantage.

He will now appear in Surry Hills Children's Court on 20 January 2020.

Woman issued infringement notice for Low Range PCA - Epping

About 11:40pm on Friday 6 December 2019, police were conducting stationary random breath testing on Epping Road at Marsfield. A 54-year-old woman was stopped by police and submitted to a breath test. The woman returned a positive roadside test and was arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station where she underwent a breath analysis.

The woman returned a reading of 0.058 and was issued with an infringement notice for Drive with Low Range PCA.

Man charged with numerous offences Meadowbank

About 8:20pm on Saturday 20 December 2019 an alarm activation occurred on a construction site in Sherbrooke Road, Meadowbank. Upon the land there is a two storey structure under construction. Police were contacted and arrived a short time later to find a 31-year-old man from Meadowbank inside the construction site.

The man was arrested and searched. Police located a packet of tools which consisted of a pair of wire cutting pliers, and a screw driver with various socket screw heads. On observing the packet of tools, it did not appear to have been opened and was still in a sealed state.

At the time of the man produced a Californian driver licence as his identification.

The man was taken to Ryde Police Station where he was charged with Enter inclosed lands, Possess housebreaking implements and Enter building/land with intent to commit indictable offence.

Further checks on the driver's licence revealed that the licence was in fact a fake licence. The identity of the man was established, and it was found that he a French citizen who was here on an expired visa that expired approximately 6 years ago.

The man was charged with use false document to influence exercise of public duty.

He is now due in Burwood Local Court on 27 January 2020.

Man charged with possess prohibited weapon -West Ryde

At 5:30am on the 3 of January 2020, police observed two men walking along Hermitage Road, West Ryde. Police stopped and spoke with the men who appeared to be affected by a drug.

After a short conversation, Police searched the men and located a pair of knuckle dusters down the pants of a 19-year-old man from Ermington.

The man was arrested and spoken to in relation to the prohibited weapon. He was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Possess Prohibited Weapon. He is now due to appear in Burwood Local Court on 3 February 2020.

Man charged with Malicious damage – Ryde

On the evening of Friday 3 January 2020, a 25-year-old man from North Parramatta was consuming alcohol in a Park, at Ryde.

About 9pm, the man has entered a Pizza restaurant, which is situated on Blaxland Road, Ryde with three females. Whilst in the restaurant, the man has become agitated and has pushed a computer monitor from the service counter. The computer monitor has fallen from the counter, landing on the floor where it has smashed. The damage has caused the screen to be inoperative and no longer functional.

The three females have grabbed the man and dragged him out of the store. Members of the public have seen the incident occur and contacted emergency services.

Police have arrived and sighted the man being restrained by one of the females. The man was detained whilst investigations took place. The man was arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station where he was charged with Malicious Damage.

He is now due to appear in Burwood Local Court on 3 February 2020.

Woman charged with Possess Prohibited Drug – Hunters Hill

About 11:30 pm on Friday 3 January 2020, Police were patrolling Park Road, Hunters Hill when they observed a 22-year-old woman from Hunters Hill walking in a southerly direction on Park Road, towards Ryde Road.

Police stopped and spoke with the woman. After speaking with her for a short time, police had cause to search the woman.

Police searched a satchel bag that was carried by the woman and during the search, Police located a plastic bag that contained a white crystalline powder, which Police will allege is Methylamphetamine.

The woman was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Possess prohibited Drug. She will now appear in Burwood Local Court on 10 February 2020.

Man charged with Goods in Custody

About 1350 on Saturday 4 January 2020, a 52-year-old man from Muswellbrook was observed by police to be slumped over the steering wheel of his vehicle in a car park at North Ryde.

The vehicle window was down but the man was asleep and sweating profusely. Police woke the man up. Due to the calls received from the public in relation to the man driving erratically, the way the man had parked his vehicle and the man's actions when speaking to the police, police believed the man may be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

The man and his vehicle were searched. Police located an electric bike with in the rear of the vehicle. Police spoke with the man in relation to the bike. Police believed that the bike was stolen or unlawfully obtained.

The man was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Goods in Custody.

He will now appear in Burwood Local Court at a later date.

Police reminding residents to lock their homes

Recently there has been a number of Break and Enters across the Ryde Police Area Command and in particular the Cherrybrook Area. Thieves have gained entry via garage doors and then into the home via an unlocked internal door from the garage to the home. Ryde police wish to remind residents to ensure that their garage doors are locked and secured and that any internal doors that lead to the home via the garage are also locked and secured.

With the warmer weather, residents also tend to leave windows and doors open. Thieves can enter your home via these windows and doors. To enhance your homes security, it is worth considering investing in window locks and alarm systems.

High Range PCA - Ryde

About 4:10am on Sunday 12 January 2020, a 19-year-old provisional driver from Doonside was travelling in his vehicle, travelling North on Church Street, Ryde. Police observed the man's vehicle to be driving in a very poor manner, drifting in and out of lanes without indicating.

The man was stopped by police and submitted to a breath test. He returned a positive roadside test and was arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station for a breath analysis.

The man returned a reading of 0.153 and was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Drive with High Range PCA. His licence was suspended by Police and he is now due to appear in Burwood Local Court at a later date.

Persons trespassing – Epping

About 4:30pm on Sunday 12 January 2019, police received a call regarding multiple persons jumping the external perimeter fence at the abandoned Epping TAFE in Chelmsford Avenue, Epping.

Police attended the location and located 5 people, 4 19-year-old men and a 19-year-old woman in an abandoned room. On entering the room, Police observed several drug paraphernalia items on the table located in the middle of the room. All 5 people were searched with police locating a clear resealable bag containing what is believed to be Cannabis in the back pack belonging to a 19-year-old man from Lidcombe. Police also located two grinding devices, 2 white tablets (believed to be a synthetic drug), 1 white tablet believed to be to be MDMA, and a clear resealable bag containing a brown powder referred to as THC. Police also located a knife in a sheath.

The 19-year-old man was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Possess prohibited Drug, Possession of a knife in a public place and Trespassing. He will appear in Burwood Local Court at a later date.

The four other people were issued with an infringement notice for trespassing.

Shoplifter – Macquarie Park

About 1:30 pm Wednesday 8 January 2020, a 23-year-old woman from Pendle Hill has entered a Shopping Complex at Macquarie Park. She proceeded to a clothing store and purchased an item of clothing.

The woman has then entered a department store and picked up a cosmetic item where she removed the security sticker and placed the item into her handbag. The woman has then left the store without making any payment for the item.

The woman has then attended a cosmetics store where she has picked up a number of items and removed the security stickers. The woman has placed these items inside her bag and then left the store without paying for the items.

Once outside the store, the woman was stopped by the stores Loss Prevention Officer who had witnessed the woman 's actions. She was taken to the security office to await the arrival of police.

Police arrived a short time later and spoke with the woman before issuing the woman with a Court Attendance Notice for shoplifting. She is now due to appear in Burwood Local Court on 24 February 2020.

Man charged with Supply Prohibited Drug

About 10:00pm on Friday 10 January 2020, police observed a vehicle travelling west on Victoria Road West Ryde, before turning into a car park. Police followed the vehicle and stopped it inside the car park.

Police spoke with the driver and the other two occupants of the vehicle. After speaking with the three men, police had cause to search the vehicle and the occupants.

A search of the vehicle was commenced and, in the foot, well of the rear left side passenger, a black spectacle case was located. Inside this case were two bottles of an unknown clear liquid. A small piece of aluminium foil was located containing a small quantity of what police allege to be methylamphetamine. In addition to this, police located a clear piece of plastic bag containing a quantity of what police allege to be methylamphetamine. A glass pipe, commonly used for the ingestion of methylamphetamine was located along with a straw and small blister packs of an unknown medication. A ball of aluminium foil, inside of which was more clear plastic containing a further amount of what police allege to be methylamphetamine. Finally, in the rear seat, a quantity of what police allege to be methylamphetamine was located, packaged in the same clear plastic material as the substances previously located.

A 45-year-old man from Pennant Hills was placed under arrest and taken to Ryde Police Station. On searching the man's belongings, police located a sum of cash and another small quantity of what police will allege is methylamphetamine.

The man was charged with Supply prohibited drug, Possess prohibited drug and Goods in personal custody suspected being stolen. He was bail refused to appear in Parramatta Local Court on 11 January 2020. The man was again bail refused and is now due to appear in Burwood Local Court on 15 January 2020.

Cannabis Caution

At 11:00pm on 8 January 2020, police were patrolling the Meadowbank Park on Constitution Road, Meadowbank when they observed a vehicle parked in the car park. Police approached the vehicle and spoke with the 25-year-old man from Granville.

After speaking with the man for a short time police had cause to search the man. Police located a clear-resealable bag containing what is believed to be Cannabis in his bag.

Police issued the man with a Cannabis Caution for being in possession of the prohibited drug.
