Man arrested after allegedly attacking police officer - Ryde

A man has been arrested after allegedly attacking a police officer with a knife in Sydney's north-west.

About 8.45am on Wednesday 21 August 2019, officers from Ryde Police Area Command were on Culloden Road near Waterloo Road, Marsfield, when they observed a man walking in the middle of the roadway.

Officers approached the man and asked him to move to the footpath and when they attempted to guide him off the road, a physical altercation took place and he allegedly struck a male constable with a knife to the arm, causing a laceration.

A Taser was deployed, and the man was arrested.

NSW Ambulance paramedics took the man under police guard to Royal North Shore Hospital for assessment.

The officer was taken to hospital for treatment. His injuries were not life-threatening.

A crime scene was established and an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the incident has commenced.

Shoplifter – Macquarie Park

About 1pm on Friday 23 August 2019. A 47-year-old woman from Ryde has entered a department store in Macquarie Park. The woman has selected a number of items from various departments and placed them into bags she was carrying. These actions were witnessed by the stores Loss Prevention Officers.

The woman has exited the store walking past cash registers without attempting to pay for the items.

The woman was stopped by the Loss Prevention Officers and security and escorted to the security office to await the arrival of police.

Police arrived a short time later and spoke to the woman. Police searched the woman and her belongings before issuing the woman with a Court Attendance notice for Shoplifting. She will now appear in Burwood Local Court on 14 October 2019.

Man charged with numerous offences - Gladesville

About 10:00 pm on Thursday 22 August 2019, Police were patrolling a car park on Pittwater Road at Gladesville when they observed a vehicle parked at that location. Police conducted checks on the vehicle which revealed that the plates on the vehicle had been stolen from another vehicle back in 2016.

Police approached the vehicle and observed a 25-year-old man from Ryde asleep in the vehicle with the keys in the ignition. Police opened the driver's door and the man alighted from the vehicle. The man was placed under arrest and was searched.

Police located a number of items including a car key that did not belong to the vehicle he was driving in a shoulder bag he had with him. Police also located a torch, a large sum of loose coins, a credit card in the name of another person and a clear resealable plastic bag that contained what is believed to be Cannabis.

Police conducted further checks on the vehicle and found that the vehicle had been stolen between 6 August and 7 August 2019 from a Gladesville address during a break and enter incident.

The man was taken to Ryde Police Station where he was charged with a number of offences including, Be carried in conveyance taken without consent of owner, Goods in personal custody suspected being stolen (Motor Vehicle), Enter vehicle without consent of owner/occupier, Possess implements to enter/drive conveyance, Commit s114 offence, having previous conviction, two counts of Goods in personal custody suspected being stolen and Possess Prohibited Drug.

The he man was refused bail police and appeared in Burwood Local Court on 23 August 2019 where he was granted conditional bail to appear in Burwood Local Court on 27 August 2019.

Man charged with Supply Prohibited Drug - Carlingford

About 8pm on Wednesday 21 August 2019, police were patrolling the Carlingford area when they observed a vehicle parked in Darwin Street Carlingford.

Police approached the vehicle to speak with the two 19-year-old men who were seated inside the vehicle. As the window of the vehicle was lowered police immediately smelt a strong smell of Cannabis emanating from the open window.

Police spoke with the two men who handed police a resealable plastic bag containing what is believed to be Cannabis from within the centre console of the vehicle.

The man got out of the vehicle and searched the two men as well as the vehicle. In the glove compartment of the vehicle police located a large resealable plastic bag containing four separate resealable bags containing what is believed to be Cannabis. Two smaller resealable bags, one containing empty resealable bags and the other containing empty capsules, a bag containing a brown crystalline substance and more empty/ unused resealable bags, a set of digital scales and a sum of cash was located in the top of the centre console.

Both men were arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station. A 19-year-old man from Carlingford was charged with two counts of Supply Prohibited Drug.

The man will now appear in Burwood Local Court on 2 September 2019.

Man arrested with breaching his bail conditions – North Ryde

On 8 April 2019, a 21-year-old man from North Epping was charged with a domestic assault. At the time, he attended Burwood Local Court and was granted conditional bail.

About 6:30pm on Thursday 22 August 2019, Police were conducting patrols of Blenheim Road, North Ryde, when they observed a White Mitsubishi parked at the Northern end of the road, with two occupants sitting in the drivers and front passengers' seats.

Police stopped and approached the vehicle. Upon approaching the vehicle Police sighted the 21-year-old man in the driver's seat of the vehicle and a woman in the front passenger, as well as a large cloud of smoke inside the vehicle. Police immediately smelt cannabis smoke emitting from the windows of the vehicle. For this reason, Police requested both people exit the vehicle.

Police made enquiries and discovered that the two occupants were in breach of their bail conditions. The two were placed under arrest and searched along with the vehicle.

Police located a 10 cm 'butterfly' knife in a black garbage bag in the boot of the vehicle.

The two were taken to Ryde Police Station where the 21-year-old man was charged with breaching his bail conditions. He will now appear in Burwood Local Court on 23 August 2019.

Three new Police recruits join Ryde Police Area Command

The NSW Police Force welcomed 269 new probationary constables to its ranks at the Police Academy in Goulburn on Friday 23 August 2019.

‘Class 338’ includes 177 policemen and 92 policewomen who will complete 12 months on-the-job training and study of the Associate Degree in Policing Practice by distance education with Charles Sturt University before being confirmed to the rank of constable.

NSW Police Commissioner Mick Fuller APM was joined by the Minister for Police and Emergency Services, The Honourable David Elliott MP, who inspected the new recruits on the parade ground.

Commissioner Fuller today welcomed the new recruits into the policing family.

“These new probationary constables will join their Commands on Monday, after months of training away from their homes and families,” Commissioner Fuller said.

“I have no doubt that every day will prove both challenging and rewarding for these recruits as they begin their career as police officers.

“They will be stationed right across the state where they will spend the next 12 months learning what it truly means to wear the two-blues uniform,” Commissioner Fuller said.

Three of these new recruits joined the Ryde Police Area Command commencing duty on Monday 26 August 2019.

Monday 2 September 2019

Man charged with Middle Range PCA and Offensive Behaviour Ryde

About 12:35am on Tuesday 27 August 2019, Police were patrolling the Ryde area when they observed a vehicle stationary on the Devlin Street offramp at the intersection of Victoria Road, Ryde. The traffic lights at this intersection turned green and the vehicle did not move.

Traffic behind the vehicle beeped their horns however the vehicle failed to move forward, with the lights turning orange, then red, causing all vehicles to miss the green light.

At the next change of lights, the vehicle moved forward and turned left onto Victoria Road. Police stopped the vehicle and spoke with a 34-year-old man from Ermington before submitting him to a breath test.

The man returned a positive roadside test and was arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station for a breath analysis.

The man returned a reading of 0.096. On leaving the police station the man has urinated on the sandstone wall outside the police station in full view of motorists driving along Victoria Road. The man was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Drive with Middle Range PCA -2nd offence and Offensive Behaviour. His licence was suspended by police and he will now appear in Burwood Local Court on 14 October 2019.

Man charged with a number of offences - Ryde

About 4.20pm on Thursday 29 August 2019, a 30-year-old man from Campsie has entered a supermarket in Ryde. The man was seen by the stores Loss Prevention Officer to place eleven tins of baby formula into a duffle bag he was carrying with him before placing it over his shoulder and exiting the store without attempting to pay for the items.

The Loss Prevention Officer followed the man as he exited the store, before stopping him as he was waiting for the elevator outside. He was then escorted back to the store to await the arrival of police.

Police arrived a short time later and spoke with the man. He was searched by police who located the baby formula inside the duffel bag. The man was arrested and issued a banning notice by the store for a period of 12 months. The man was then taken to Ryde Police Station where further checks were conducted on the man.

Police discovered that the man was disqualified from driving from May 2019 to November 2019. About 6:40pm on the same day Police returned to the shopping centre car park to find the mans car parked at that location. Police searched the vehicle and located a further 24 tins of baby formula along with a bottle of alcohol and designer brand sunglasses.

The man was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Shoplifting, Goods In Custody and Drive motor vehicle during disqualification period - 2nd offence. He was given conditional bail and will now appear in Burwood Local Court on 23 September 2019.

Man charged – West Ryde

About 12:00pm on Friday 30 August 2019, police attended a licensed premise in West Ryde in relation to a 19-year-old man who had two outstanding arrest warrants. Police located the man seated in the gaming area of the premise.

When Police approached the man to speak with him, the man has pushed an officer in the chest and ran past the officer out of the premise. Police pursued the man on foot to a near by unit complex. Police located the man attempting to hide in a stairwell.

The man was arrested and searched. Police located a mobile phone on the man which did not belong to him. The man was taken to Ryde Police Station.

About 3:10pm on the same date, a woman has attended Ryde Police Station stating that the man was in possession of her phone.

The man was charged with Goods in Custody, Assault Police and Resist Police. The man was bail refused and will appear in Burwood Local Court on 3 September 2019.

Man charged with drugs – Hunters Hill

About 9:30 pm on Saturday 31 August 2019, Police were patrolling Joubert Street, Hunters Hill when they observed a 49-year-old man from Telopea in a communal carp-park of a unit complex.

On speaking with the man, police noticed that he appeared to be affected by drugs. Police searched the man and located a plastic container inside the man's front pocket which contained a white crystalline powder, which Police will allege is Methylamphetamine.

The man was arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station where he was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Possess Prohibited Drug. He will now appear in Parramatta Local Court on 12 September 2019.

Shoplifter - Ryde

About 4:30pm on Friday 30 August 2019, a 22-year-old man from Marsden Park entered a supermarket at Ryde. The man has selected a number of items off the shelf and placed them into the trolley he was pushing.

The man has then attended the self-service checkout where he scanned some of the items but not all of them. Staff noticed that the man was not scanning all of the items. The man paid for the items that he scanned however he did not pay for the items he placed into his bags that were not scanned.

Once the man left the store he was stopped by security who escorted him to the security office.

Police arrived a short time later where he was spoke to before being issued with a Criminal Infringement Notice for Shoplifting.

Police investigate house fire - Hunters Hill

Officers from Ryde Police Area Command are investigating the circumstances surrounding a house fire in Hunters Hill.

Emergency services were called to a home on Futuna Street, Hunters Hill about 7.30pm on Wednesday 4 September 2019 following reports of a fire.

On arrival officers found the home to be well alight; Fire and Rescue NSW officers worked quickly to extinguish the blaze that has caused significant structural damage to the home.

Four neighbouring properties were evacuated as a precaution. There were no reports of injuries.

At this stage police believe the residents were away.

Investigations continue.

Shoplifter – Macquarie Park

About 1:00pm on Sunday 8 September 2019, a 44-year-old man from St Ives has entered a department store in Macquarie Park. The man has selected a number of items off the shelf and left the store without attempting to pay for the items.

The man has then returned to his vehicle and placed the items in his vehicle. The man has then returned to the department store and met up with his partner. As the two have attempted to exit the store again, they were stopped by security and escorted to the security office.

The movements of the man were captured on CCTV and witnessed by security. Security contacted police who arrived a short time later and spoke with the man and his partner.

Police searched the man's vehicle and located the items he has taken from the store.

The man was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for shoplifting. He is now due to appear in Burwood Local Court on 4 November 2019. He was also issued with a banning notice for a period of 12 months to not attend the department store.

High Range PCA – Macquarie Park.

About 2:05am on Friday 7 September 2019, police were conducting stationary random breath testing south on the Herring Road off ramp from the M2 Motorway, Macquarie Park as part of an operation.

Police stopped a 28-year-old woman from Ryde and submitted her to a breath test which returned a positive reading. The woman was arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station for a breath analysis.

The woman returned a reading of 0.180 and was issued with a Court Attendance notice for Drive with High Range PCA. She is now due to appear in Burwood Local Court on 23 September 2019.

Man charged with numerous offences

About 5.00 pm on Thursday 18 July 2019, a resident secured his vehicle in his garage in Hunters Hill. At 7am the next morning he returned to find his garage open and his vehicle stolen.

About 11:00 pm on Tuesday 30 July 2019, the vehicle was travelling in a northerly direction on Lane Cove Road, North Ryde at an estimated speed of 60 km/h when a 25-year-old man from Ryde was occupying the driver seat of the vehicle. The man lost control of the vehicle and as result, the vehicle collided with a power pole that was situated on the nature strip of the Lane Cove Road, North Ryde.

The man and another male passenger exited the vehicle and left the location.

About 7:45 am on Tuesday 3 September 2019, Police attended the man's home in Ryde. When he opened the door and saw police, the man ran out of the back door. Police pursued the man into the rear yard where he was arrested.

The man was taken to Ryde Police Station where checks revealed that the man is disqualified from driving until 2048. The man was charged with Take and drive conveyance without consent of owner, Enter vehicle or boat without consent of owner, Drive motor vehicle during disqualification period - 2nd+off, Negligent Driving Resist Arrest and Not give particulars to police. He was granted conditional bail and will now appear in Burwood Local Court on 17 September 2019.

High Range PCA -North Ryde

About 5.30pm on Wednesday 4 September 2019, a 31-year-old man from Eastwood was travelling south on Delhi Road, North Ryde, when he has lost control of his vehicle before colliding with a power pole.

The man has exited from his vehicle and run off into nearby bushland. A member of the public has contacted police who arrived a short time later.

Police entered the bushland to find the man, laying on the ground, Police observed him to be heavily intoxicated he was slurring his speech and his pants and shirt were soiled.

The man was submitted to a breath test which returned positive. He was arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station where he was submitted to a breath analysis where he returned a reading of 0.242.

The man was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Drive with High Range PCA. He will now appear in Burwood Local Court at a later date.
