#### ADDITIONAL WALKS - EVERY MONTH UNTIL OCTOBER

Following the resounding success of the most recent walk on Sunday, 30th May, and in response to mare requests for "more walks", the Trust has decided to offer residents a chance to take part in a similar walk even month through to the end of October. The new "monthly walk" will be held on the last Sunday of each month of the next four months. Mark it in your diary. The programme for the rest of the year is as follows:

July 25th: Beecroft Tour. Village Green, Chilworth Reserve & Fernleigh Park. Meet at Village Green, 2.00 p.m.

August 29th: Botanical and Adventure Walks. Starting from Day Road Picnic Area. "Adventure Walks is for the fit. Meet at Day Road Picnic Area at 2.00 p.m.

September 26th: North Epping to Cheltenham. Meet at the corner of Boundary Road and Braidwo

### OBSERVATORY PARK

Observatory Park is that triangular area of parkland bounded by the northern end of Beecroft Road and Per Botanic Gardens, Observatory Park is a remnant of the "Blue Gum High Forest vegetation which grew on this site prior to European settlement". The Royal Botanic Gardens also says "this type of vegetation once extended over about 11,000 hectares on the deep shale-based soils on ridges in the high rainfall as Observatory Park where a remnant of the Blue Gum High Forest can be conserved and enhanced is scientifically". Road widening of Pennant Hills Road will soon take a strip of vegetation along the western of Observatory Park, but most of the park will remain intact. The Trust has some concern, however, park.
