1. How will you address the cost of living in Australia?

To include – not limited to:

- Halving fuel excise with flow on effects reducing cost of travel, commuting and reducing price pressure on groceries,
- couple with a dependent child to split income,
- allow aged and veteran pensioners to work without penalty.
- no excise rises for 3 three years,
- Introduce indexation of tax rates to eliminate bracket creep

2. How will you restore the opportunity for Australian families to purchase their own home?

To include – not limited to;

- End mass immigration to ensure housing availability and reduce increase rental pressure,
- Establish "People's Mortgages"
- Allow HECS debts to be rolled into People Mortgage enabling home loans banks would refuse.
- Implement GST moratorium on new home build materials reducing cost of building
- Allow superannuation account to be invested in their home, closing deposit gap.
- Scrap costly building code mandates such as compulsory wheelchair compliance.

3. How will you protect the environment?

- One Nation will focus of Water "more than just a resource". It is the lifeblood of Australia.
- implement a Nation Water Infrastructure program to increase storage capacity and distribution to end users and ensure safe consumption. Australia's economic, social and environmental future depends on it.
- protect old growth forests. Prevent industrial wind and solar, access roads and transmission lines being erected on native forests.
- Ban offshore wind turbines on environmental damage grounds.

4. What plans do you have to ensure Australian energy security?

- Due to the vastness of Australia, we depend on all forms of energy. Not one or two types will not benefit the environment or the support the future, therefore we will focus on building a multi sourced, clean, reliable and cheap energy grid, utilising clean coal, gas, hydro, nuclear, kinetic, solar and wind. All these forms of energy are the future.
- Amend the National Electricity Market (NEM) rules to promote affordable coal and gas baseload power in the medium term.

5. How will you enhance educational opportunities for all Australians?

 Australia continues to rank lower than comparable high- and middle-income countries in achieving quality education outcomes. One Nation will restore critical thinking in the classroom and reinstate the cornerstone of education with reading, writing, arithmetic, and discipline. There should be no room for Western, white, gender, guilt shaming in any classroom and instead children should be taught the benefits of a merit-based, free-thinking society.

6. How will you ensure access to good healthcare for all Australians?

- Increase Medicare rebate by \$3bn a year to better pay GPs and promote bulk billing,
- One Nation recognises the need to bolster the number of regional doctors, nurses, and other critical health professionals. One Nation will introduce three-year contracts for newly qualified medical professionals and in return pay their HECS-HELP loans in full.
- Tackle Medicare fraud costing Australians up to \$3 billion annually.

7. What is your plan for better transport in the electorate?

- This is a State and Local Government responsibility for which One Nation should not interfere at a federal level.

8. What is your plan for addressing Indigenous disadvantage?

- Save up to \$12.5 billion by abolishing National Indigenous Australians Agency (NIAA) and provide direct aid to those in need.

9. What is your plan for Australia's defence?

- It is time to take back our borders
- Refuse entry to migrants from nations known to foster extremist ideologies incompatible with Australian values,
- Deport any visa holder who breaks the law,
- One Nation has strongly supported the expansion of Australia's defence capabilities, advocating for greater investment in our military assets to ensure we are never left vulnerable in an uncertain world.
- Increase defence spending to 2.5% of GDP increasing to 3% by 2035. Purchases to concentrate on missile and drone technology to multiply our force.

10. How will you encourage respect for the common good of all Australians?

- Introduce citizen-initiated referenda,
- Enshrine human rights in the Constitution, including right to free speech, freedom of association and freedom of movement.
